Recent History of UE

- In 2017, the NPS Advisory School Board voted to dismantle UE
 - They did this with no plan for replacement, so at next meeting they voted to not dismantle in order to study issue further.
- The Board's assumption of full powers with the return to local control in January 2018 renewed talks of changing or ending UE
 - Three board members formed their own committee to examine the issue; they have called for two separate systems for charters and NPS.
 - Despite acknowledging the advantages of a common enrollment system and the improvements over time, they remained upset about the history of UE being state-imposed by Superintendents Anderson and Cerf.
- Publicly, new Superintendent Roger Leon suggested improvements, but not the dismantling of UE or excluding charters
 - Nevertheless, he abruptly forced the resignation of the 3-person leadership team at NPS responsible for overseeing the system; these personnel actions took effect on July 1 (his first day as Superintendent).

Timeline of UE MOU Negotiation

- April-May 2018
 - NCSF engages with NPS Board committee reviewing universal enrollment
 - NCSF contingency plans for separate charter system, developing business plan

• June 2018

- Incoming Superintendent Roger León fires key people on enrollment team
- NCSF contracts with research group to study algorithm so it can be replicated if needed.

• July 2018

- Roger León holds meeting with charters, publicly committing to universal enrollment.
- August 2018
 - PDC prepares MOU 6 with minor changes and submits to NPS for review and approval
- September 2018
 - NPS accepts our changes and proposes several more, including eliminating overmatching
- October 2018
 - PDC pushes back on the overmatching issues, which is critical for independent charters
 - NPS Board does not vote on UE MOU at regular meeting, making it impossible for charter to approve

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Current Status of UE MOU

- On November 8, Superintendent León met with charter leaders explaining MOU
 - Charters expressed overmatching is a serious issue and NPS not passing MOU holds up their approval
- On November 12, NPS Board held an emergency meeting to approve MOU
 - Superintendent gave vocal defense of UE and reaffirmed his commitment to current system
 - 6 members voted yes, 2 abstained, one was absent
- Language limiting overmatching was simply omitted
 - Charters celebrated lack of limits on overmatching
 - Superintendent León said he doesn't believe it is necessary but said no major changes were made to the agreement

<u>NCSF and partners have successfully negotiated a MOU agreement that all previously committed charters have</u> <u>agreed to and that the Newark Board of Education has approved.</u> We must continue to be vigilant to ensure that the system is implemented effectively by the District for our charter school partners.

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Next Steps with UE

Currently in motion:

- MOU has been shared for charter approval during their November/December board meetings
- NCSF and NJCF considering ways to support NPS to ensure smooth implementation

- February 15: Application closes
- Week of April 15: Matches released
