

## How Nonprofits Can Support a Fair and Accurate Census

A lot is at stake with Census 2020. Our schools, roads, environment, and healthcare depend on billions of federal dollars that come into New Jersey – more than \$22.7 billion in FY2016. If *all* state residents are not counted, the whole state will suffer.

As nonprofits serving New Jersey's residents, we have well-established relationships and speak communities' languages. We are one of the few remaining trusted entities that can help everyone in New Jersey to be counted. The following checklist provides a roadmap for action now to support a fair and accurate Census 2020.

□ Does your organization serve populations that are the hardest to count (children under age

	five, people of color, renters, immigrants, people who are new to the area)?  Will your organization, or the people you serve, be impacted by cuts in federal funding for healthcare, social services, education, transportation, food, or housing as a result of people not being counted in the census?  Will your organization, or the communities you serve, be affected by cuts in political representation as a result of people not being counted in the census?  Does your nonprofit maintain frequent contact and have a trusting relationship with the people you serve?	
ENGAGE IN THE STATEWIDE EFFORT TO COUNT EVERYONE IN NEW JERSEY

EDUCATE AND MOBILIZE YOUR COMMUNITY		
	Include information on your website, mailing, e-mail blasts, social media, and at board/staff/volunteer meetings to inform people why the census matters to your community.	
	Host a community forum on the importance of a fair and accurate count.  Establish or join a local complete count committee to develop census plans to generate a complete count in your community.	
	Help local residents apply for jobs with the Census Bureau to help people in your community be counted.  Serve as a local "get counted" center where people can access computers or tablets to complete their census forms.
