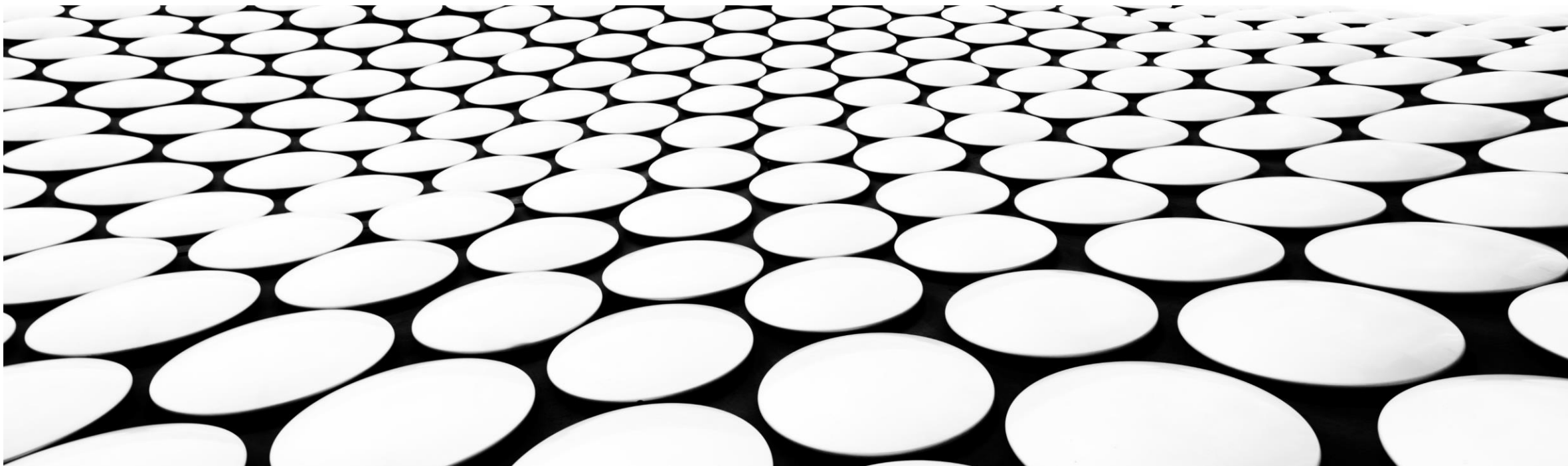

WHY NONPROFITS NEED CYBERSECURITY



- Example: Spear Phishing Attack
- Example: Ransomware Attack

Security incidents can harm constituents, divert resources from programs, and damage the organization's reputation.



CHALLENGES AND COVID-19

- Since Covid, ransomware, in which criminals encrypt files and then demand a ransom to restore access, is up 90%, according to a recent report by VMware.
- Remote workforces may not have the cyber-protection of being behind a corporate firewall
 - VPN?
 - MFA?
- Security awareness training is a critical component in helping to prevent cybersecurity incidents
 - Covid-related scams and phishing

HOW FOUNDATIONS CAN SUPPORT NONPROFIT CYBERSECURITY

- Help with organization capacity grants to fund:
 - Third Party Risk Assessment Strategy (TPRA)
 - Cybersecurity Insurance Pool. Cybersecurity insurance may be worth it for nonprofits and foundations when there is potential exposure to data loss or a data breach due to a Cyber Security Incident
 - Resource assistance in creating an Information Security Program development such as NIST Cybersecurity Framework
