ERB Investments


- 81 projects have been approved, including the commitment of over \$144.6 million in Economic Recovery Board grants, recoverable grants and loans resulting in a total public/private investment of \$844 million.
- These investments support the creation of an estimated 1,100 new, full time jobs in the City of Camden.
- Combined assistance of over \$370 million from the Department of Community Affairs, the Housing Mortgage Finance Agency and the ERB has resulted in the construction of 2,562 housing units throughout the City.







North Camden

Northgate IIFair Share Housing Corporation



- 402 units in a high-rise building and 14 two-story lowrise garden-style apartments
- HMFA originally financed this project in 1979 and refinanced in 2004
- \$1.2 million in ERB funds for low-rise portion
- \$20.6 million in HMFA financing
- \$10.3 million in LIHTC equity
- \$3.4 million from DCA





Cramer Hill

Nueva Vida Homes Cramer Hill CDC

- 14 for sale homes completed
- \$824,000 in ERB funding
- \$653,000 in HMFA financing
- \$670,000 in HMFA CHOICE subsidy
- Phase II is seeking \$1.9 million in HMFA financing and \$2 million in CHOICE subsidy

River Road Affordable Housing (MiCasa)

Michaels Development Company

- 79 newly constructed two and three bedroom stacked rental townhomes completed
 December 2007
- Contains a computer learning center and offices used by the Cramer Hill CDC
- \$3,500,000 from ERB
- \$13,400,000 in LIHTC equity
- \$2,000,000 in DCA Balanced Housing funds

Boyd & Morse Phase I

St. Joseph's Carpenter Society



- 18 newly constructed home ownership units in the pipeline
- Partnership with Cooper's Ferry on road infrastructure work
- \$3,570,000 from ERB
- \$1,750,000 in HMFA financing
- \$1,800,000 in HMFA subsidy

Cooper Grant Housing Pennrose Properties

- 18 new for sale town homes units
- \$1.2 million from ERB
- \$2.55 million in HMFA financing
- \$1.376 million in HMFA subsidies
- Completed August 2008

Cooper's Hill Phase 1B

- 25 unit new construction mid-rise condo building.
- 4 affordable housing units; remaining 21 units will be emerging market units.
- \$1.1 million CHOICE construction financing
- \$2.5 million CHOICE subsidy.
- Completion date: Aug. 2010



Park Boulevard Phase II, IIB and III Parkside Business and Community in Partnership



- \$395,000 in ERB funds
- \$650,000 in HMFA financing
- \$1.7 million in CHOICE subsidy
- Phase III is in the pipeline for 30 more units.

- 16 rehabilitated single family homes to be completed November 2008
- \$788,000 from ERB
- \$395,700 in HMFA financing
- \$1,493,479 in HMFA subsidies
- Phase II is in the pipeline for another 8 homes

RPM Development

- Two part project under construction:
 - rehabilitation of an historic building downtown providing retail space and 36 units for seniors
 - 35 new and rehab units in the Fairview neighborhood
- 10 units for homeless veterans
- \$3,000,000 in ERB funding
- \$1,000,000 in Special Needs funding
- \$10,400,000 in LIHTC equity
- \$6,000,000 from Balanced Housing









- \$182 million HOPE VI revitalization project- 664 units of affordable housing, for-sale & rental
- Infrastructure upgrades throughout residential development
- 2 community centers
- New library construction
- Park/open space enhancements

Fairview Village & Yorkship Square RPM, Inc.

- Phases I, II and III rehabilitated 112 rental units and 75 for sale units
- Phase IV seeking to develop 30 for sale units
- \$1 million in ERB financing for Yorkship Square and Fairview Village.
- \$6 million in HMFA financing;\$11.2 in LIHTC equity; \$1 million in Special Needs funds; \$7 million in HMFA subsidies
- \$5.5 million in DCA funding





The Camden Home Improvement Program



"CHIP"

- Provides forgivable loans of up to \$20,000 to low and moderate income homeowners for essential home repairs
- Will assist 250-300 homeowners throughout the City over next three years
- Cooper's Ferry is Program Manger
- Funding:
- \$5 million ERB
- \$2.5 million DCA
- Additional funds from the City of Camden
